## WHY DO A HEALTH SCREEN?

Preventative screening is essential for your Junior pet's best quality of life. Each year of a pet's life represents 5-10% of its total life span. Performing these procedures once each year is the same as once every 5-7 years for a Junior adult person.

Obtaining a baseline value for your pet helps in establishing unique normal values that our veterinarians can monitor over time. This allows them to see even subtle changes as your pet ages. We will be able to better detect and treat illnesses early, before you pet display symptoms.

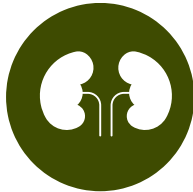

#### LIVER HEALTH

. ALT . AST . ALP . GGT .

The Liver is a major workhorse in your pet's body! From storing vitamins, to regulating body temperature, to protein, fat, & carbohydrate metabolism, the liver is a big organ with an even bigger job in keeping your pet healthy!



#### KIDNEY HEALTH

. CREATININE . BUN .  
. PHOSPHORUS .

The Kidneys are like the filter system for your pet's body! They work hard to remove waste through urine and keep things clean & running smoothly! Did you know the kidneys also regulate electrolytes and blood pressure?



#### ELECTROLYTES

. SODIUM . POTASSIUM .  
. CHLORIDE .

Electrolytes are not just found in sports drinks! They are in our bodies and our pets' bodies, as well! Electrolytes have the important job of regulating the nervous system and the fluids in your pet's body.



#### PANCREAS HEALTH

. AMYLASE . LIPASE .

The Pancreas has the amazing job of producing insulin and digestive enzymes. This little guy is also extremely sensitive and lets your pet know when it's angry! One of the easiest ways to upset the Pancreas (Pancreatitis) is by feeding your pet human foods or fatty foods (like pork, beef, etc.).



#### HEALTH OF CELLS

. COMPLETE BLOOD COUNT .

The CBC checks your pet for inflammation, infection, anemia, blood clotting time, and so much more! We can tell a lot about your pet's health through evaluating the size, amount, and type of blood cells present in your pet's blood sample.



#### URINALYSIS

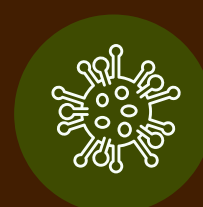
. COMPLETES THE PICTURE .

Your pet's urinalysis tells your vet about your pet's bladder health, urinary tract function, and kidney function. It can also help to diagnose diseases such as Diabetes and even some types of cancers. Who knew urine told us so much?!



#### HEARTWORM TEST

This is a blood test for the presence of heartworm antigen. Your pet must test negative prior to implementation of heartworm prevention and prior to restarting missed dosages. Heartworm prevention manufactures require this test once yearly to ensure product efficacy.



#### RETROVIRAL SCREENING

. FeLV / FIV Test .  
This is a blood test for the presence of Feline Leukemia and Feline Immunodeficiency Virus. Your pet must test negative prior to receiving the FeLV Vaccine.



#### INTESTINAL PARASITES

Examination of your pet's feces under a microscope for clues about many different kinds of diseases, including difficulties with digestion, internal bleeding, and pancreas disorders. Most importantly, fecal examination will confirm the presence of intestinal parasites such as roundworm, hookworm, whipworm, tapeworm, coccidia, and giardia. If left undiagnosed, intestinal parasites can cause vomiting, diarrhea, coughing, poor absorption of nutrients and may be transmitted to other household members. The center of disease control recommends deworming and fecal evaluations every 6-12 months depending upon individual risk and lifestyles.

## BENEFITS OF HEALTH PROGRAM



The goal of this is to offer a bundle of medical diagnostic tests for our junior pets at a discounted rate in order to make these tests more affordable. We want to help make certain there are no underlying problems not readily detectable on the physical examination. This screening will also give us an individual baseline for future comparison.



The Junior stage of a pet's life provides us the opportunity to not only maintain optimum health for your pet, but also prepare for the more fragile Seniors.
